WHAT'S YOUR CREDIT SCORE?

I remember years ago I was young, wild and running against the wind with no worries, cares or concerns. Life was easy--being employed a year or two before graduating high school put me in a position early to be able to buy anything I wanted whenever I wanted it. That was fun. I had great credit and several credit cards, including American Express with no credit limit. I still can't figure out why they trusted a kid fresh out of school with a credit card without a preset limit. I was able to handle the payments fairly easily, up until the time I purchased a vehicle. Then things began to slowly unravel. Nobody had told me that cars need regular maintenance and without it you are bound for major problems.

Well, I began to have car problems which cost me a fortune. I had to start cutting down on reckless spending; I also stopped "wasting money" paying the credit card bills. That was my logic back then. So there I was--crippled with a huge credit card debt and bills still piling up from everything else. Things became worse when several of the creditors got a judgment against me and the courts began attaching my wages to pay them back. This quickly led to my downfall. For many years afterwards I was literally in "credit hell" with all my cards closed; I couldn't even get approved for a *free mobile phone*! It was so bad that I gave up on credit and loans and FICO scores. I just got a debit card to pay for things.

This worked for me for years and believe it or not, I was content. In this day and time a debit card will only work for certain things but for others, you need a credit card. In one instance I needed a credit card to rent a car since they wouldn't take my debit card. So I decided to take the leap and apply for another credit card. I was older and wiser by then; I felt I could responsibly manage it. But my hopes and dreams were eventually shot down after each application was rejected. I just told myself to forget it and I left it alone. But, I wasn't aware that time heals all woundseven financially devastating wounds.

One day I happened to be riding with my sister and her family. Out of the blue her son asked me what my credit score was. I was befuddled at that question coming from a 5 or 6 year old. I was even more befuddled because I had no idea what my score was. When he told me to check Credit Karma on my phone, we all just laughed and went on to our destination. But at home I was still thinking about his question and I decided to see what my credit score was. I was shocked to find out that I didn't *have* a FICO score at all; it was just three dashes on the screen. Then I wanted to check out my credit reports to see why. Once I got my reports I saw that all the negative stuff had fallen off over the years. Now I basically had a clean file with no credit history at allwhich is almost as bad as having poor credit.

There is a good ending to this story so please read on. While visiting the bank where I had the heavily used debit card, one of the employees asked me if I had one of their credit cards. I laughed and said, "I have no credit, so y'all will just deny me anyway." He said maybe not and asked to check for me. I was in a hurry, but I did give him permission to email me information about it. Time went by and instead of getting an email, I got a letter inviting me to apply for a credit card. I called the number given and applied over the phone. To my shock they approved me for a credit card. It had a low limit but I was happy anyway.

Today I am much, much older and much, much wiser; this time I will not screw up. Looking back, I wish I had people who could have taught me how to use credit to my advantage and make it work for me instead of just using credit to buy stuff. We should aim to help our children avoid the pitfalls of misusing credit, while at the same time teach them the importance of credit management. Remember, just because you might be buried under a load of credit debt, it's still possible that one day you will be breathing freely again like I am. So, what's *your* credit score?
