
Mission Statement

Praising God For Milestones, Maintaining Hope, and Preparing For Post Pandemic Recovery Rev. Jeannette B. Gatewood-Johnson



There was a time when global numbers for Covid-19 were rising in every category. Statistically, my zip code was number one in all of Baltimore City and Baltimore was number one in the State of Maryland for positive Covid-19 tests, hospitalizations, and death! I couldn't believe it!! I became dismayed, angry, upset, and frightened. Then, something else came over me...a sense of calm and courage from a deeper acknowledgement of the assurance that the God in me will do the work. But what work? The task seemed so large and I was only one person and seemed so small in the big scheme of things. My scope felt very narrow. Then, I thought again. I started thinking what can I do, how can I do it, who can help me and where will we get the money? I sure had more questions than answers. One thing I knew, I wasn't going to mention my embryonic, half-baked thoughts to anybody. The other thing I knew, I couldn't be the only person out here thinking like this!

I started writing things down: my thoughts, my feelings, my goals, possible potential partners who shared my thoughts. Then, I started developing something that took the place of doubt and fear...It was passion! I realized that if I just acted on the idea, somehow, there would be an attraction in the Universe to bring the idea to fruition. It was not for me to figure out how, who, what, or finances.

I started thinking about the idea of *decreasing* positive Covid results to less than 3% in my 21215 zip code and in every community worldwide by decreasing numbers until Covid-19 is eradicated. I shared my passion and the idea with my family, and 2 of my closest friends. Then, I got a text from someone that I had never mentioned the idea to. "I know some people who are looking to invest in communities. Send me your ideas with your vision and mission statements and a short budget." I COULDN'T BELIEVE IT!

I submitted the requested information, however the idea was not selected for the project. But, I was not discouraged. In fact, I thought, I'll just get started with a grass-roots style with boots on the ground and passion in my heart. I can touch people one at a time until I reach hundreds of people at a time. She was working with a group of women who had a new thought about women engaging in the workforce and the community differently. Their latest community engagement was contact tracing and Covid-19 initiatives, because Black people were dying at higher rates than other races. Then, she asked the 64 million dollar question: "What are you doing lately"? Was this God showing up? I shared my ideas with her. She introduced me to the head of an organization promoting a new attitude and practice in the workplace--providing training, and community engagement for women of color. Their latest endeavor is promoting health equity, community outreach, bringing vaccines, information, hope, and empowerment for individuals to make healthy decisions.

As a new team member, I am realizing my vision as the Public & Community Health Program Director in an organization called ElevateHer, Inc. We have been awarded our first grants and are continuing to pursue more grants that focus on reduction in Covid-19 positive case counts and positivity rates within the Black and Brown communities in Maryland, Virginia, and Washington, DC (not just 21215)!

Our goals are to not only to improve access to resources, but also increase TRUSTED presence and resources in underserved communities. We plan to do this through the following:

- Active partnerships with policy makers and community leaders working together to solve present challenges,
- Develop strategies for post pandemic recovery, and
- Place sustaining public health outreach projects in our communities that promote health, eradicate disparity and health inequity.

Ultimately, we hope to achieve and maintain systems for optimal health of the residents we serve.

My takeaway from all this:

Praise God! My not giving in to fears and the deceit of defeat, my maintaining hope amid chaos, milestones in my life are all being fulfilled. "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In His great mercy He has given us new birth into a living hope..." I Peter 1:3 (NIV).

So...Hold on, hold fast, don't give up, and don't give out. There is life, sweet, sweet life after Covid-19. Maintain your physical, mental and emotional health. Recovery from the Pandemic is imminent and grounded in your spiritual health.
