I received word recently about a grandmother that Angel Wings had served during our very first year we started this journey. Betty was a hard worker, who cared for her two grandchildren due to unfortunate circumstances way back in 1996. Her transition brought tears to my eyes. It seemed only reasonable that a group of individuals could pull together to assist others. That first year, four families were our initial inspiration to do a good deed and assist others who find themselves in dire circumstances. It has now been 21 years that Angel Wings has served families, mostly at Christmastime and more recently, supplied school items, uniforms and other clothing at the beginning of the school year.



In December of 2020 our organization completed the distribution of our annual Secret Santa gifts of toys, clothes, hygiene kits and household products. We battled not only the effects of Covid-19, our isolation experiences, the shutdown of churches, but also the halt on travel to many places that we have frequented before the pandemic. Despite the odds as a collective group, we were happy that we served 41 families with 117 children of all ages. During those last days of purchasing, wrapping and distributing gifts, I felt lethargic but I kept pushing on. I postponed going for testing because I didn't have the energy to get dressed an make it to an urgent care center. That day I got an emergency call to help a family in crisis, a mom who had lost both her jobs during the pandemic. I remember writing a check for the family and one of our board members helped to deliver their "Christmas." This was December 23rd. I called one of my nephews to wish him a happy birthday; that was all I could manage. The next thing I remember was my husband calling the EMT's to rush me to the hospital. For the first 48 hours I was at the mercy of the medical staff who put me in isolation an wore masks and PPE. I had been diagnosed with Covid-19.

I floated on a sea of prayers sent across the airways from all over the country. The hospital staff providing my care bombarded me with fluids and medicines in one arm and from the other arm blood was drawn and tested. By the third day I was beginning to come around and that was Christmas Day. As I looked out the window of

"Do not call to mind the former things; forget all that; it is nothing compared to what I am going to do..." [Isaiah 43:18,19 New Living Translation]

So, what's this "falling UP" about? I mean, I've heard of falling in, falling out, and falling down. But what does falling *up* entail?

Actually, the fall season doesn't bring out the best in me. Thinking about dead leaves, the dread of dreary rainy weather, back-to-school woes, ending of summer fun...this does not sound exciting or inspirational. Learning to wait is an agricultural posture. From parables we Christians have learned about seasons of sowing and reaping. But only mature prayer warriors take the leap of faith into practicing patience and perseverance during the wait time between the two.

During the time of waiting, the soul develops a dependence on God that demonstrates a new level of trust. That doubt or discontent which once plagued a worrier eventually dissipates, and a prayer WARRIOR emerges.

Now, I am called to recognize a breakthrough in my own spiritual journey-a milestone where I can look back on my life and acknowledge that I'm not where I once was, but I've still got a log way to go. Things are not as bleak as before; I can put my past behind me, and boldly seek guidance to move forward. Whatever afflictions or addictions or circumstances that brought me to this point will no longer hinder me; they have helped me make what I am today. I am an Overcomer! Thank God!

My mother and father (then) had five children. We were known as "stair steps," meaning we were just one year apart in ages. My father was a sailor. As adults, my siblings joked that we could tell when Daddy was home on leave. Our birthdays fall in the months of November and February.

Mama did not discuss with us what happened during that Christmas, when Daddy abruptly decided to take his paycheck and go to Hawaii. He left us without providing for food or Christmas gifts.

I cannot remember how we kids found out what Daddy did. I just remember a neighbor placing money in the pocket of the apron Mama wore. I remember when the neighborhood milkman left chocolate and white milk, at his own expense. My uncles, who had young families themselves, collected money from the family. They purchased for us a crate of oranges and apples. The Presbyterian Church where we attended provided each of us kids with a gift. The pastor visited our home and prayed for our mother and for us.

I received a doll that year and it was so special to me that I remember it to this day. I remember holding and hugging that doll like a friend. And that doll was a symbol of the kindness, love, and support we received from people who cared.

My father's selfish and prodigal behavior that year towards his family gave my mother and us children a greater faith and a greater testimony. I can truly say that through this experience God made himself known to us as a "Father" who is always faithful. A "Father" who is not only omnipresent, but who also ministers to those in need through human angels.

Over the years Angel Wings has provided gifts and hope to families who find themselves in dire circumstances. May God continue to bless this ministry, along with all the others in this mission field.
