PRAYER POWER New Year's Resolution for 2015 TIME MANAGEMENT

One Gift we each get is time. Every person gets the same amount—one day at a time. What we *do* with it is up to us. Every day is a gift; that's why we call it "THE PRESENT."

Time is a commodity more precious than money; once it's gone, you can never get it back. Thus the phrase "wasting time, or "spending time", or "redeeming time" is more real than most are aware. Once the moment is gone, that time or season, if you will, is in the past, and cannot be regained.

So, it is critical that we believers make the best use of the time God has given us. Since stewardship is the man-made governing of a God-given resource, it is fair to say that time-management, then, is really a matter of *stewardship*, rather than office efficiency. That seems difficult, especially when so many pressures and temptations close in on us to take up our time. Every year—while others resolve to organize their closets, diet, or exercise more regularly—I strive to organize my calendar. Since God has given me the same 24 hours as everyone else, I know it is up to me to govern how I spend my time. **Once I realized I need help, it has been an opportunity for prayerful confession and submission.**

First of all, I must admit to God that I have a tendency to procrastinate and/or waste time. Then, I can honestly ask for help in better stewardship, or management of my time. In that way I can evaluate how well I spent the day without feeling guilty. As a



recovering people-pleaser, I had to confess that over-booking schedules, while impressive, was not productive. Neither was there any time for much-needed rest. Now, finally, I can turn the matter over to the Lord every morning, prayerfully set priorities, proceed throughout the day cautiously and jealously. ["My time is precious; should I spend it this way?"] By the end of the day, I can report back to God – hopefully for a "Well done!"

Understanding that time is not the enemy, but rather a GIFT is an important revelation. Identifying the real enemy is important, so that one can become victorious in the battle of time management. Whether it be peer pressure, the desire to be the 'savior,' meeting the expectations of others, avoiding a problem by staying busy—all these and other factors can push one to over-extending oneself. So then, busy-ness, or dragging one's feet becomes a tool of the enemy. *Lord, deliver me from my enemies!*

But I trust in you, O Lord; I say, "You are my God." My times are in your hand; deliver me from the hand of my enemies and persecutors. Let your face shine upon your servant; save me in your steadfast love. Psalm 31:14-16

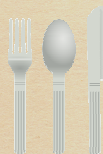
